Some items to keep in mind as we gather for worship in this place:



C: "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God..." and "...the wages of sin is death."

P: Jesus did this by giving His life as a ransom, a ransom He paid by His death on a cross. This is why He came in flesh. This is why we celebrate Christmas. For as the Lord has also had recorded down in Romans ...

C: "and *all* are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus" and "...the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

What is in a name? A reminder we can all use, and that is ... God is with us.

Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz, ¹¹ "Ask the LORD your God for a sign, whether in the deepest depths or in the highest heights." ¹² But Ahaz said, "I will not ask; I will not put the LORD to the test." ¹³ Then Isaiah said, "Hear now, you house of David! Is it not enough to try the patience of humans? Will you try the patience of my God also? ¹⁴ Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.

(refrain) Go, tell it on the mountain, Over the hills, and ev'rywhere; Go, tell it on the mountain That Jesus Christ is born.

While shepherds kept their watching O'er silent flocks by night, Behold, throughout the heavens There shone a holy light. *Refrain* ...

The shepherds feared and trembled When lo, above the earth Rang out the angel chorus That hailed our Savior's birth. *Refrain* ... Down in a lowly manger The humble Christ was born; And God sent us salvation That blessed Christmas morn. *Refrain* ...



A Reading from Holy Scripture ... Titus 3:4-7

How generous is God? Recall what He has done for you, and why He did this.

But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, ⁵ he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, ⁶ whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, ⁷ so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life.

A Reading from Holy Scripture ... Luke 2:1-20

What can Jesus possibly give to us that can make a difference? The peace He holds out has no equal.

And it came to pass in those days *that* a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered.² This census first took place while Quirinius was governing Syria.³ So all went to be registered, everyone to his own city. ⁴ Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵ to be registered with Mary, his betrothed wife, who was with child. ⁶So it was, that while they were there, the days were completed for her to be delivered. ⁷And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. ⁸Now there were in the same country shepherds living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹ And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were greatly afraid. ¹⁰ Then the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people. ¹¹ For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹² And this *will be* the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger."¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!" ¹⁵ So it was, when the angels had gone away from them into heaven, that the shepherds said to one another, "Let us now go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us."
