Easter Egg Hunt ... As we approach Easter, we're gearing up for our next Community Connection event, the annual Easter Egg Hunt. It'll be held on Saturday, March 30th from 10 am

to noon on the church & school grounds. We will be serving sandwiches, chips, and cookies for lunch, with funds provided through a Thrivent Action Grant. This is a big community event, so we're looking for some assistance from the congregation with both donations and volunteers. **Donations include**: small candies and toys (think Oriental Trading) to put in the plastic Easter Eggs (preferably not chocolate since that could melt if it's a warm day), and larger prizes to be handed out when the children find the special resurrection eggs.
