

He lives triumphant from the grave; He lives eternally to save. He lives all-glorious in the sky; He lives exalted there on high.

M: Death has been swallowed up in victory.

(1 Cor. 15)

Women: Where, O death, is your victory?

Men: Where, O death, is your sting?

(no intro) He lives to bless me with his love; He lives to plead for me above. He lives, my hungry soul to feed; He lives to help in time of need.

He lives to grant me rich supply; He lives to guide me with his eye. He lives to comfort me when faint; He lives to hear my soul's complaint.

M: The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.

C: But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

(no intro) He lives to silence all my fears; He lives to wipe away my tears. He lives to calm my troubled heart; He lives all blessings to impart.

He lives, my kind, wise, heav'nly friend; He lives and loves me to the end. He lives, and while he lives I'll sing; He lives, my Prophet, Priest, and King.

M: We worship in the name of God - the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

C: Let us worship Him.

(no intro) He lives and grants me daily breath; He lives, and I shall conquer death. He lives my mansion to prepare; He lives to bring me safely there.

He lives, all glory to his name! He lives, my Jesus, still the same. Oh, the sweet joy this sentence gives: "I know that my Redeemer lives!"

M: Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance:

C: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners – of whom I am the worst.

M: If we confess our sins,

C: He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

M: Beloved in the Lord: let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God our Father, asking Him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.

All: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed You in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve Your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

M: This is how God showed His love among us:

Men: He sent His one and only Son into the world that we might live through Him.

M: This is love:

Women: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.

M: God our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given His only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen. Thanks be to God.

M: Jesus said to her (*Martha*), "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me will live, even though he dies;

C: and whoever lives and believes in Me will never die.

M: Do you believe this?"

C: Yes!

M: Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.

C: Amen. Let us live for Him.

#### A READING FROM HOLY SCRIPTURE

Isaiah 53 (Responsive)

P: Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?

C: He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground.

P: He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him.

C: He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

P: Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows,

C: Yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted.

P: But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities;

C: The punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed.

P: We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way:

C: And the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

P: Yet it was the LORD's will to crush him and cause him to suffer, and though the LORD makes his life a guilt offering,


C: He will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the LORD will prosper in his hand.

P: After the suffering of his soul, he will see the light (of Life) and be satisfied;

#### A READING FROM HOLY SCRIPTURE

Acts 2:29-39

<sup>29</sup> "Fellow Israelites, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day. <sup>30</sup> But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. <sup>31</sup> Seeing what was to come, he spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, that he was not abandoned to the realm of the dead, nor did his body see decay. <sup>32</sup> God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of it. <sup>33</sup> Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear. <sup>34</sup> For David did not ascend to heaven, and yet he said,

"The Lord said to my Lord:

"Sit at my right hand

<sup>35</sup> until I make your enemies

a footstool for your feet."

<sup>36</sup> "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah."

<sup>37</sup> When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"

<sup>38</sup> Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. <sup>39</sup> The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call."

M: The Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God! Let us worship Him.

#### A READING FROM HOLY SCRIPTURE

Luke 24:1-12

On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. <sup>2</sup> They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, <sup>3</sup> but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. <sup>4</sup> While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. <sup>5</sup> In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? <sup>6</sup> He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: <sup>7</sup> 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' "<sup>8</sup> Then they remembered his words. <sup>9</sup> When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. <sup>10</sup> It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. <sup>11</sup> But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. <sup>12</sup> Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.

M: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God! Let us worship Him.
